### Mission Statement

### Legislative Priorities

- Emphasizing the utmost importance of safety on Wyoming's construction sites and roadways.

- Developing a long-term funding solution for state construction priorities and strategic planning for future generations.
- Improving and/or reducing government regulations—at the state and federal levels—that stymie business operations and prevent a flourishing economy.
  - Continuing improvement in public works statutes to refine definitions and clarify confusing bureaucratic processes.
  - Working with state agencies to effectively and efficiently implement federal mandates (BABA, labor laws, etc.).
- Protecting against erosion to tax revenues that local governments use to repair and update aging infrastructure, build safe roads and bridges, and improve the well-being of our communities. Supporting targeted and appropriate relief from taxes where warranted.
- Developing and training the next generation of Wyoming's workforce through career and technical education programs in schools, skilled trade and on-the-job training programs, and touting the benefits of successful and fulfilling careers in our industry.
